

GMCC Mapping Application

A brief manual.

Map Viewer

The map viewer allows you to view maps that have been built using the Map Builder application.

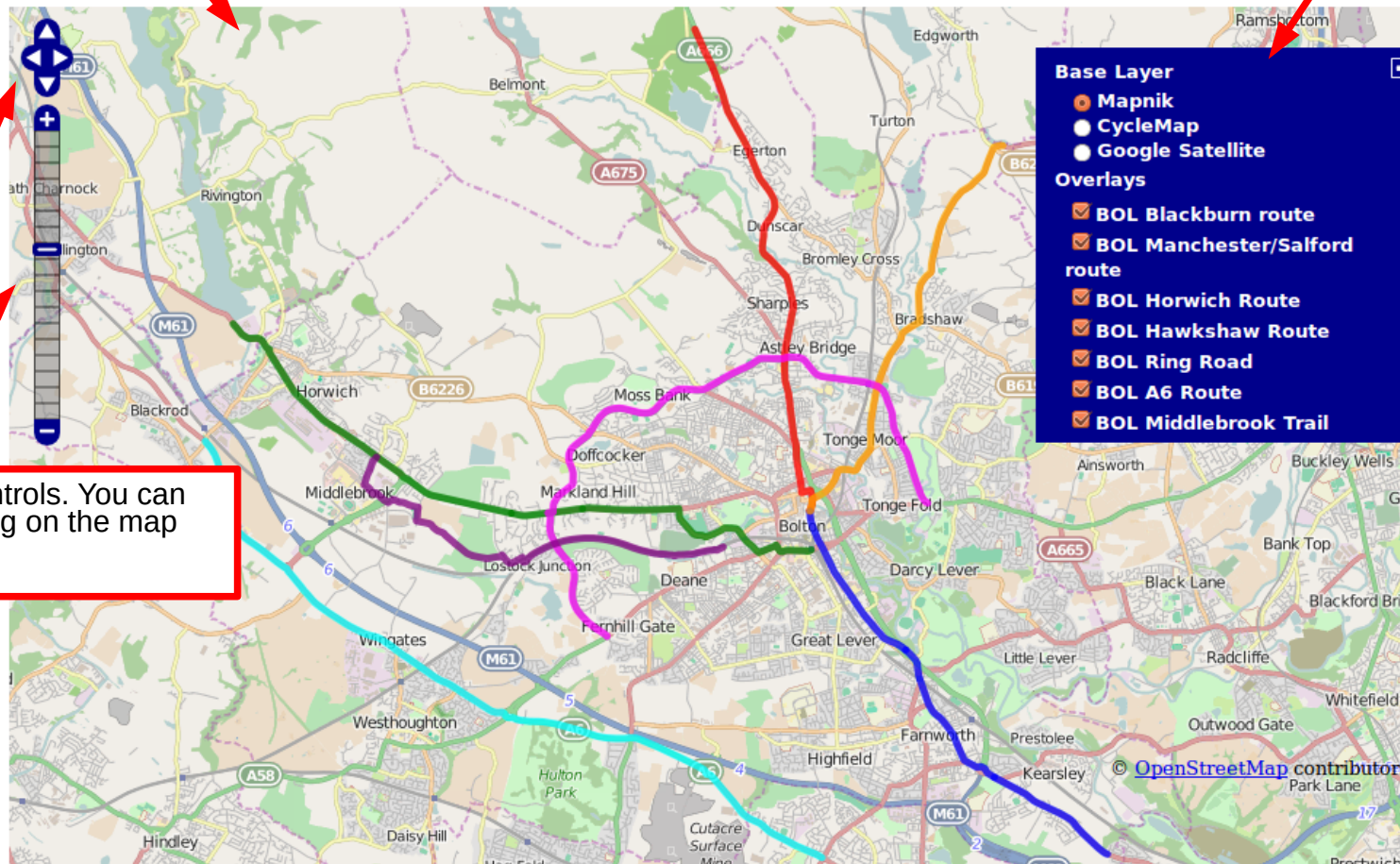
You don't need any special permissions to view maps.

The following pages shows the main controls in the Map Viewer.

The map itself is created and displayed using the OpenLayers mapping library.

Most of the page is taken up by the map, which shows routes that have been added by the person who built the map.

Allows you to show or hide routes and/or change the background map. (This starts off hidden, with a small '+' icon to reveal it.)



Pan and scale controls. You can also pan by clicking on the map and dragging.

Hover the pointer over a route to see information. Click a route to pin (freeze) the info, then click the pin (📌) to unpin it.

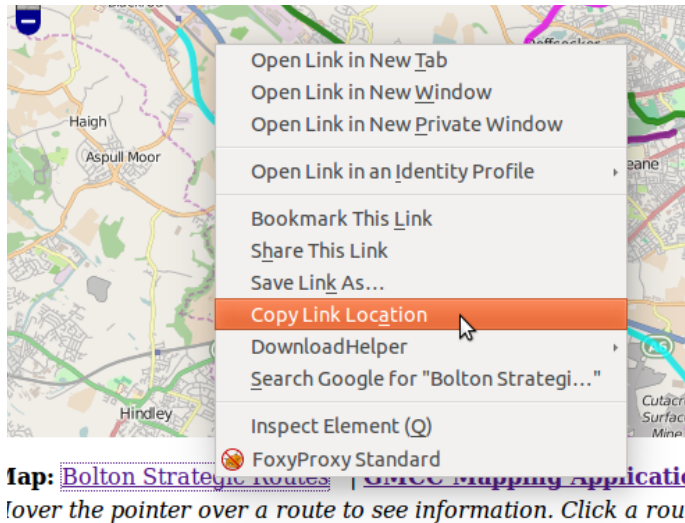
This provides a direct link (URL) to the map. The link may be copied for use in web pages. Maps accessed using this link will have a simplified user interface.

Click to return to the list of available maps.

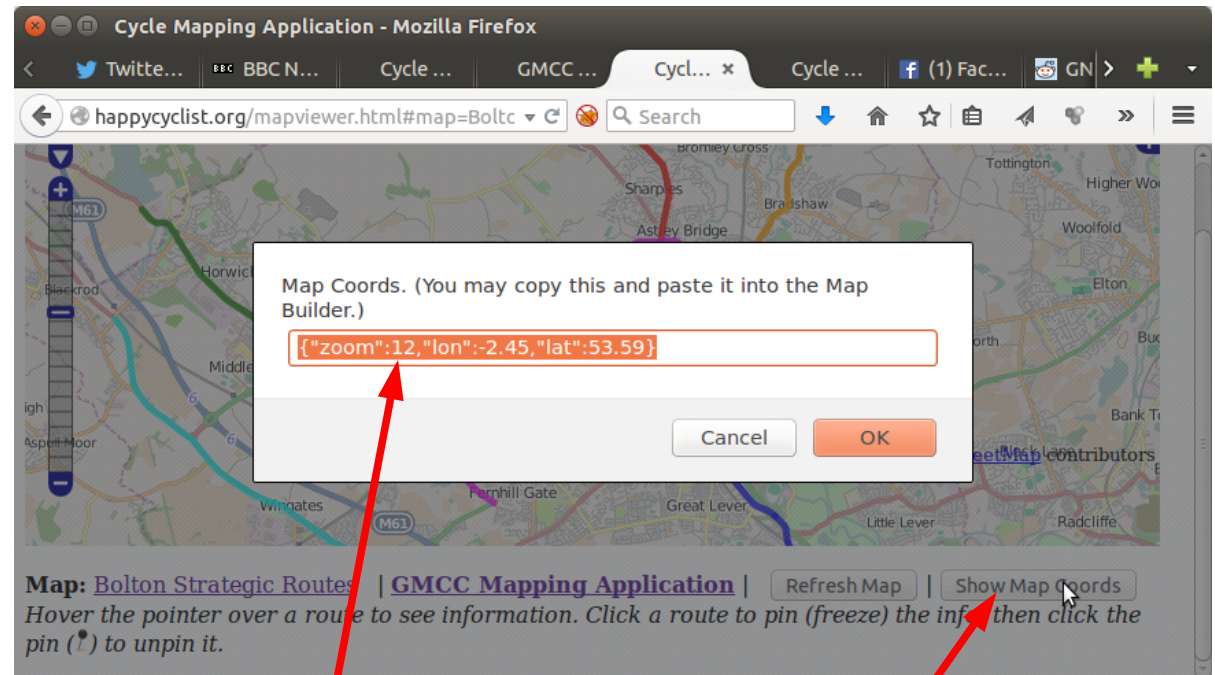
Click to refresh the map. (Handy if you are using the Map Builder.)

Click to open a dialogue box showing the current zoom and position. This may be copied and pasted into the Map Builder.

Using some of the controls in the Map Viewer



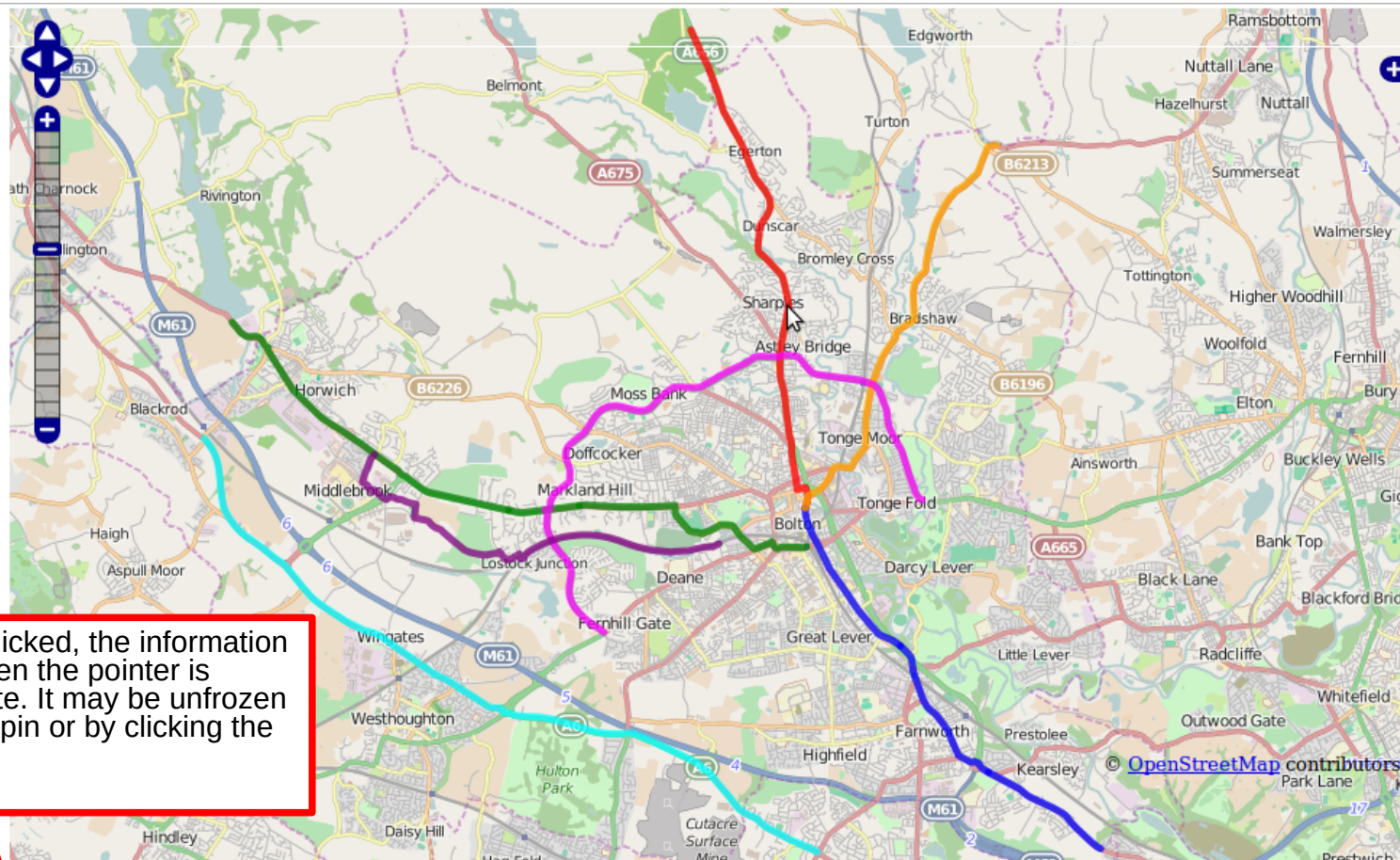
Copying the direct link (URL) for a map in Firefox browser. The menu is obtained by right clicking on the map name.



Display the current map position and zoom level using the *Show Map Coords* button.

The text string shown may be copied and then pasted into the Map Builder to set the map's default position and zoom level.

Shows the map when the mouse pointer is hovered over a route. (The red one in this case.) The text at the bottom changes to show information about the route.



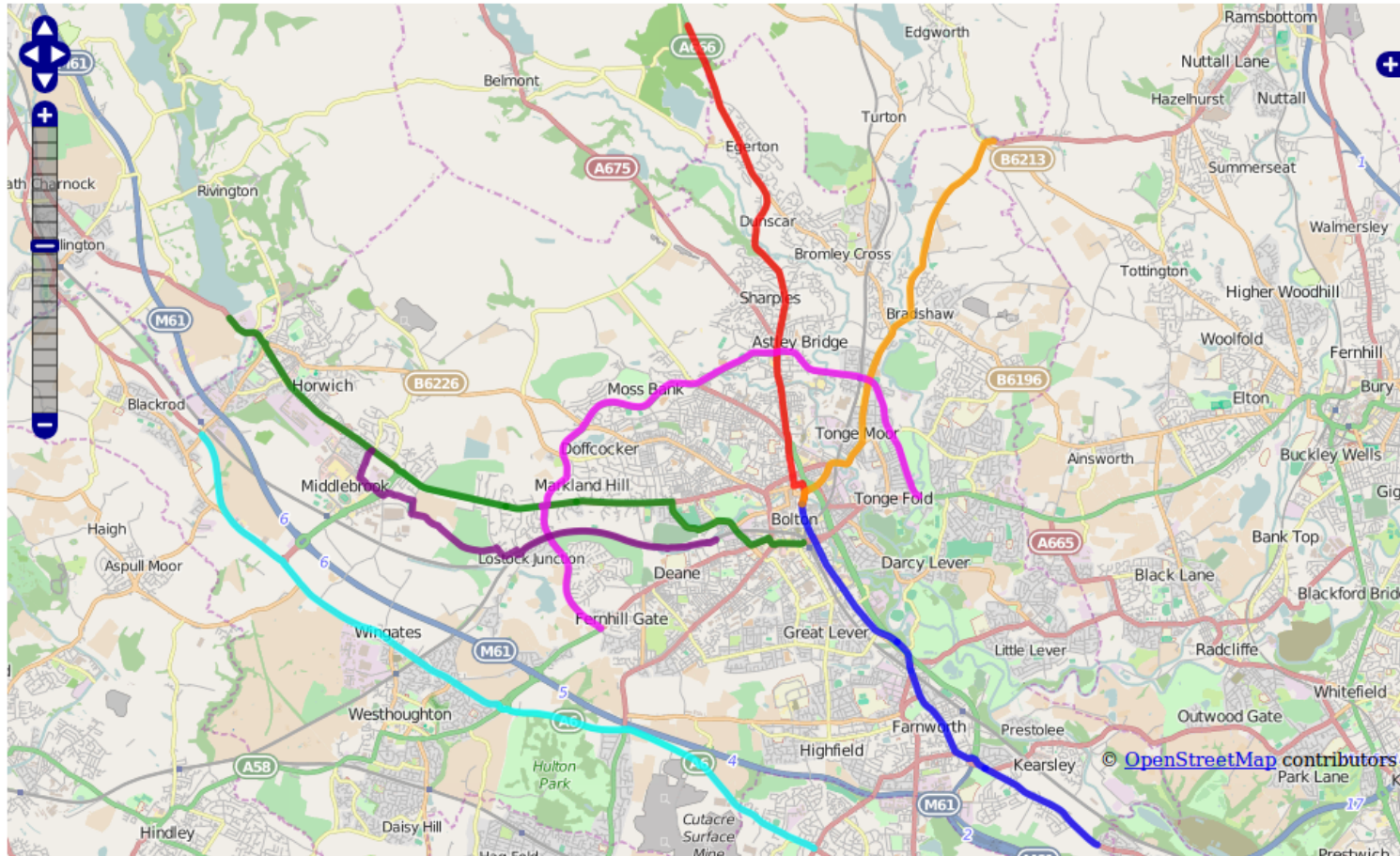
When a route is clicked, the information is frozen even when the pointer is moved off the route. It may be unfrozen by clicking on the pin or by clicking the route again.

Map Builder

This section contains brief instructions for the Map Builder application.

This application allows you to create maps and add routes (GPX files) to them for display in the Map Viewer.

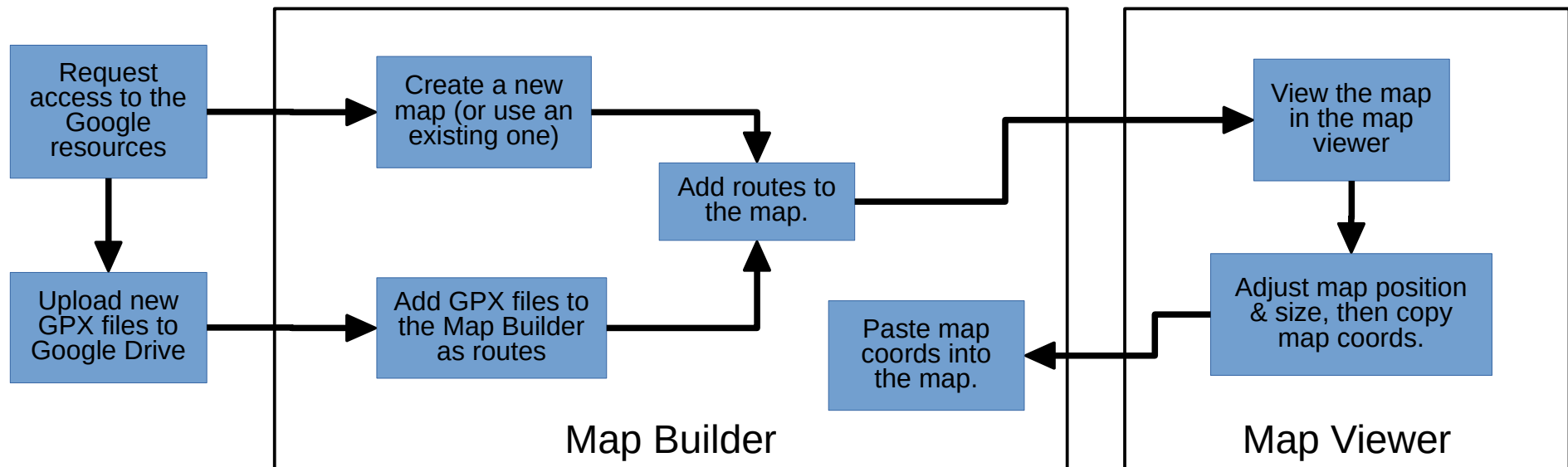
GPX files may be added to the server by uploading them to the *GPX Files* folder in Google drive. In order for you to gain access to this folder, you must have a google account, and the folder (as well as the Google Fusion Tables that are used in the application) must have been shared with you via your Google Drive. To get these resources shared with you, you need to ask the system administrator. (Grahame Cooper for this test installation.)

The available line styles are defined in one of the Google Fusion tables and may be edited there.

Workflow:

This is the workflow for creating and editing maps.



Shows a list of the names and descriptions of all the available maps in the system. When you select one of these, the data about the map will be shown in the fields below the list box.

Creates a new map using the data that is currently shown in the field below the *Maps* list box. The Name field must not be the same as that of an existing map. The lon, lat and zoom fields should be used to set the initial longitude and latitude of the centre of the map and the initial zoom level. If these are blank or invalid, the map viewer will just set the map to show an overview of Greater Manchester. To find suitable values for these, you can set the map position and zoom in the map viewer and then see the settings using the map viewer's *Show map coords* button.

Load the routes that are included in the currently selected map into the *Routes on Map* box. You can then start to manage which routes are included in the loaded map and the styles in which they should be shown.

This will update the information about the map that is currently selected in the *Maps* list box to the values shown in the fields. (The name of a map cannot be changed as this is used as an identifier for the map.)

Allows you to paste a coordinate set into the lon, lat and zoom boxes. The coordinate set is in the form: {"zoom":12,"lon":-2.45,"lat":53.58} and may be copied using the map viewer's *Show map coords* button.

The controls in the Maps box.

Shows a list of the names and GPX file names of all the available routes (GPX files) in the system. When you select one of these, the data about the route will be shown in the fields below the list box.

Allows filtering of the route list. (Currently only by ownership as specified in Google drive.)

Deletes the currently selected route from the available routes in the system. This does not delete the GPX file from the server; that can be done in the Google drive GPXFiles folder.

Adds the currently selected route to the map whose routes are being displayed in the "Routes on map:" box. You may specify a different display style for the route using the Alt Colour field.

These three controls are used to add a new GPX file to the available routes. The drop down list shows all the GPX files on the server that have not yet been added. New GPX files may be added to the server by uploading them into the GPXFiles folder that needs to be shared with you on your Google drive.
